- Rhode Island is the smallest state in the nation while Alaska is the largest. Rhode Island could fit into Alaska 425 times. It is the second most densely populated state in the U.S.
- The term “sideburns” is named after Ambrose Burnside, a former governor of Rhode Island!
- Rhode Island is the only state that still celebrates the end of World War II on Victory Day (which is also known as VJ Day). The official state holiday is observed each year on the second Monday of August.
- Mr. Potato Head was named as the official “family-travel ambassador” of Rhode Island in 2000. It makes sense with the Hasbro headquarters located in Pawtucket. He was also the first toy to be advertised on television.
